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Capability	All Walkers	 All walkers should read carefully the individual walk descriptions, distances and grades, and the relevant health and safety comments carefully, before deciding on their capability to complete the walk, bearing in mind that unforeseen circumstances could cause the walk to be extended, or for the group to be detained in an exposed position. Every person partaking on walks is aware (and accepts for themselves) that those perceived of as 'in charge', or leading a walk, are not qualified, do not need to be qualified, are not regarded by the group nor regard themselves as 'technical experts', but are amateur walkers with some experience who are happy to impart their knowledge and that any advice given be viewed with this in mind by the recipient. Leaders will plan walks which are within their capabilities and could reasonably be expected to be within the capabilities of the group.
